


FAMILY AND MEDICAL LEAVE ACT FMLA




FMLA General Rules



- Up to 12 weeks of leave.
- Unpaid leave.
- Concurrent paid leave.
- Includes pregnancy, illness, injury, or physical or mental conditions that require multiple treatments and absences.





FMLA COVERED EMPLOYEES

 Must have been employed at least 12 Months

Must have worked at least 1,250 hours over the 12 months immediately prior to leave



Documentation Needed to Return to Work

- Dr.'s Excuse is needed to get cleared to return to work.
- If the employee has restrictions they need to get cleared by Safety & Risk.

BEREAVEMENT LEAVE

- BEREAVEMENT FORM NEEDS TO BE SUBMITTED FOR APPROVAL TO HUMAN RESORUCES. DOCUMENT CAN BE FOUND IN THE HR WEBSITE.
- EMPLOYEE CAN GET UP TO 5 DAYS OF UNPAID BEREAVEMENT LEAVE .
- ABSENCES WILL NOT COUNT AGAINST PROFESSIONAL EMPLOYEES WHEN OUT ON BEREAVEMENT.



PERSONAL LEAVE

If an employee will be out two or more days they must fill out the Personal Leave form and submit to Human Resources for approval.

Extended Sick Leave

- Only for Professionals.
- Must exhaust all leave
- Only eligible once every 5 years

Jury Duty

- Job-protected leave.
- Not required to be paid leave
- Should not count as an absence
- Please ensure proper documents are submitted to your campus secretary.



 If an employee is out three days or more they must obtain a doctor's excuse and submit it to Safety & Risk to get cleared.





COVID-19 Quarantine and Isolation

For Anyone Who Has Been Around a Person with COVID-19

Anyone who has had <u>close contact</u> with someone with COVID-19 should stay home for 14 days **after their last exposure** to that person.

However, anyone who has had close contact with someone with COVID-19 and who meets the following criteria does **NOT** need to stay home.

• Someone who has been <u>fully vaccinated</u> and shows no symptoms of COVID-19. However, fully vaccinated people should get tested 3-5 days after their exposure, even if they don't have symptoms and wear a mask indoors in public for 14 days following exposure or until their test result is negative.

Or

- Someone who has COVID-19 illness within the previous 3 months and
- Has recovered and
- Remains without COVID-19 symptoms (for example, cough, shortness of breath)

As of August 3, 2021 there is no COVID leave available. Your available leave will be used while you are out
